Dallas College retiree honored by CASE District IV

Ann Hatch, former district director of media relations for Dallas College, recently received the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) District IV Hall of Fame Award for 2025. The award recognizes an individual's service to that organization and to higher education as a career.

"We're thrilled to celebrate Ann Hatch as recipient of the Hall of Fame Award," said Carrie Harris Phillips, chair of CASE District IV. "We thank her for her leadership, service and deep commitment to educational communications."



"I am so honored to be recognized by CASE, whose members helped me build a career that focused on telling great stories about students, faculty and staff," said Hatch. "I believe that CASE also means that we collaborate, assist, support and engage with others - something my CASE friends taught me along the way."

Hatch, who retired in 2019, worked with reporters and news media outlets for 35 years, first at Auburn University at Montgomery, then Texas Woman's University and, most recently, Dallas College. For more than three decades, she managed crisis communications; her other responsibilities included news, internal and external communications, writing, editing, speech writing, script writing and specialized communications for the Chancellor's office.



Phillips added, "Ann also has been a dedicated CASE District IV volunteer: board member, conference chair, judging coordinator, presenter — you name it, she's done it. Her impact also extends through the Texas Association of Community College Marketers and the CASE Community College Conference."

After she retired, Hatch also received the National Council of Marketing and Public Relations Petrizzo Career Service Award in 2020. She currently writes for Denton County Magazine.

Hatch holds a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's degree in political science from Auburn University at Montgomery. She has received more than 75 awards from CASE, NCMPR, PRSA (Public Relations Society of Alabama), IABC-Montgomery and other organizations.



Colorful Memories

November 22, 1963 Through a Child's Eyes

In the wake of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, filmmaker and writer Richard Snodgrass embarked on a unique project to document how young children perceived and processed the historic event. Partnering with Sacred Heart School in Prescott, Arizona, Snodgrass worked with a diverse class of first-grade students, capturing their verbal responses and their illustrated memories. The exhibition showcases original 1963 crayon drawings alongside a short film, A Child's Eyes: November 22, 1963, a recent donation to the Museum from the family of the project's art director, Hank Richter. This special installation, on view in the Museum's Seventh Floor Gallery, offers a rare and poignant look at history through the lens of childhood, highlighting a recent and unique addition to the Museum's growing collections.
