It does not represent a contract, nor does it guarantee course availability. Following this pathway will help you earn the Advanced-Level Logistics Professional Level 1 Certificate. Courses from this certificate may apply to the related AAS degree. Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours required for graduation through instruction by Dallas College. See catalog for official certificate requirements.

This certificate will develop advanced skills in logistics with a focus in specific logistics applications. The skills learned through this certificate will advance students beyond entry-level employment into management opportunities. Topics include Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) applications, transportation management, International logistics, and business communication. Courses that complete the Advanced-Level Logistics Professional Certificate are noted below.

Students pursuing this certificate are waived from the <u>Texas Success Initiative (TSI)</u> standards, but must meet course prerequisites.
