This is an example course sequence for students interested in pursuing the Criminal Justice-Digital Forensics and Private Investigation Certificate. It does not represent a contract, nor does it guarantee course availability. Following this pathway will help you earn a Level I Certificate in Criminal Justice-Digital Forensics and Private Investigation. Courses from this certificate may apply to the related A.A.S. degree. Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours required for graduation through instruction by Dallas College. See catalog for official certificate requirements.

The Level I Certificate program in Criminal Justice-Digital Forensics and Private Investigation will focus on the basics of the gathering and the analysis of evidence. Courses that complete the Level I Certificate are noted below.

Students pursuing this certificate are waived from the <u>Texas Success Initiative (TSI)</u> standards, but must meet course prerequisites, as long as the student completes the TSI waiver form prior to enrollment.

CHOOSE ONE: SLPS 2330 - Security of Computers & Data (taught by EFC faculty) OR

SLPS 2333 – Private Investigation (taught by EFC faculty)
