Following this pathway will help you earn an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Management. Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours (15 hours) required for graduation through instruction by Dallas College. Visit the catalog for official degree requirements.

The A.A.S. degree in Management is a flexible offering of business courses designed to accommodate the specific needs of currently employed students. You will learn practical management skills in the areas of goal setting, leadership, problem solving, human resources, and team building. These are skills required of successful employees, not just managers. By acquiring and applying knowledge in this field, you enhance your visibility and marketability on the job while demonstrating the capability of accepting new challenges. Courses that complete the degree will also complete the Management (MC) and Supervisor (SC) Certificates (Supervisor Certificate not offered at BHC).

ENGL 1301 - Composition I This is a Core course. You must earn a grade of "C" or better. (Course also applies to MC)

SEMESTER 1 ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Meet with your advisor to confirm academic and career goals before the end of the semester.
- Meet with a career advisor or coach to research your career options and opportunities for job shadowing.
- 3. Meet with a faculty or career advisor regarding placement for the Cooperative Education course.

SPCH 1315 – Public Speaking *This is a core course.*

SEMESTER 3 ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Meet with a faculty or career advisor regarding placement for the Cooperative Education course.
- 2. Meet with a career advisor or coach for assistance in preparing for job search.
