Following this pathway will help you earn an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Multimedia Technology-Multimedia Web Design. Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours (15 hours) required for graduation through instruction by Dallas College. See catalog for official degree requirements.

The Associate of Applied Science Degree in Multimedia Web Design is designed to enable students to participate as creative and resourceful members of a web development team. Upon successful completion of this program, the student will be experienced in creating responsive rich media websites along with creating and editing digital art, motion graphics, video, animations, graphics, and audio for use on the Internet, print and video. This degree provides an external learning experience. Courses that complete the degree also complete the Web Designer-Multimedia Level 1 (WD) Certificate and the Visual Design Level I (VD) Certificate and are noted below.
