This is an example course sequence for students interested in pursuing the Web Application Development Level I Certificate. It does not represent a contract, nor does it guarantee course availability. Following this pathway will help you earn a certificate in Web Application Development. Courses from this certificate may apply to the related A.A.S. degree. Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours required for graduation through instruction by Dallas College. See catalog for official certificate requirements.

This certificate emphasizes object-oriented programming tools to construct interactive multimedia rich websites compatible with a variety of delivery methodologies including traditional web browsers as well as handheld mobile devices. Areas of study may include object-oriented programming, handheld device SDKs, database driven web solutions, and multimedia interface web presentation. Courses that complete the certificate are noted below.

Students pursuing this certificate are waived from the <u>Texas Success Initiative (TSI)</u> standards, but must meet course prerequisites, as long as the student completes the TSI waiver form prior to enrollment.
