This is an example course sequence for students interested in pursuing Accounting. It does not represent a contract, nor does it guarantee course availability. Following this pathway will help you earn an Associate of Applied Science degree in Accounting. Students must earn at least 25% of the credit hours (15 hours) required for graduation through instruction by Dallas College. See catalog for official degree requirements.

The A.A.S. degree in Accounting is designed to prepare students for various career opportunities in accounting. Emphasis is placed on accounting procedures and generally accepted accounting principles. This program is intended to provide a foundation on which the graduate can build an accounting career through expanded experiences and/or further education. Completing the courses on this degree also completes the <u>Accounting Assistant</u> (AA) and <u>Accounting Clerk</u> (AC) Certificates. The student should apply for each certificate as it is completed. See the catalog for more information.

AAS DEGREE MINIMUM: 60 SEMESTER CREDIT HOURS

SEMESTER 1 Total Hours: 18

ACCT 2301 — Principles of Financial Accounting Must earn a grade of C or higher. ACNT 1303 and ACNT 1304 are recommended prior to enrollment in ACCT 2301 for a student with no accounting background. (Course also applies to AC, AA)

ACNT 1311 - Introduction to Computerized Accounting Must earn a grade of C or higher. (Course also applies to AC, AA)

ENGL 1301 - Composition I This is a Core course. Must earn a grade of C or higher. (Course also applies to AC, AA)

MATHEMATICS ELECTIVE This is a Core course. Must earn a grade of C or higher. There are several options to fulfill this requirement. See your academic advisor for a specific list. (Course also applies to AC. AA)

SEMESTER 1 ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Meet with your advisor to confirm academic and career goals before the end of the semester.
- 2. Meet with a career advisor or coach to research your career options and opportunities for job shadowing.

SEMESTER 2 Total Hours: 12

ACCT 2302 — Principles of Managerial Accounting Must earn a grade of C or higher. (Course applies to AA)

ACNT 1313 — Computerized Accounting Applications Must earn a grade of C or higher. (Course applies to AA)

HUMANITIES/FINE ARTS ELECTIVE This is a Core course. There are several options to fulfill this requirement. See your academic advisor for a specific list. (Course applies to AA)

CHOOSE ONE: SPCH 1311 - Introduction to Speech Communication OR

SPCH 1315 - Public Speaking OR

SPCH 1321 - Business and Professional Communication These are Core courses.

SEMESTER 2 ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Meet with your advisor to request an official program of study audit, confirm or update your academic/career path.
- 2. Meet with your advisor to apply for the Accounting Assistant Certificate Completion.
- 3. If interested in completing a Cooperative Education course (ACNT 1380 or 2380) as a specialty elective in Semesters 3 or 4, meet with a faculty or career advisor regarding placement.

SEMESTER 3 Total Hours: 15

ACNT 2303 – Intermediate Accounting I Must earn a grade of C or higher.

ECON 2301 – Principles of Macroeconomics This is a Core course.

HIST 1301 - United States History I This is a Core course.
